

MITO ALUMNI – DIPLOMA IN BUSINESS – MĀORI SCHOLARSHIP

Please read these terms and conditions carefully to ensure your application is considered.

- Incomplete applications or applications received after 5pm, Friday 17 December 2021 will not be considered
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or resident
- You must have full-time employment or an offer of full-time employment in one of MITO's industries
- You may be asked to provide evidence of ethnicity
- You must have already completed MITO's New Zealand Certificate in Business (First Line Management) (Level 4) programme that is recorded on your NZQA New Zealand Record of Achievement
- You must not be eligible for the Government's fees-free policy, which provides up to two years' free industry training for eligible learners enrolling in eligible programmes. To find out more about fees free industry training visit <u>mito.nz/free</u>
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are currently completing a qualification through MITO
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are enrolled in another training programme with any other tertiary provider
- The scholarship must be used within one year of it being awarded
- The scholarship can only be awarded once per person and is not transferable to another person
- The scholarship is not transferable to another place of employment should you change employer before the scholarship is completed, unless the new employer is within the same industry and they are willing to support you; and your previous employer and MITO both agree to the transfer
- This scholarship pays the programme fee for the New Zealand Diploma in Business (Leadership and Management) (Level 5) commencing in 2022 and to be completed at any Te Pūkenga subsidiary excluding MITO. - MITO will publish details of the scholarship recipients and may ask for further information to help promote MITO's training programmes and the scholarship programme
- A selection panel will be convened by the MITO Chief Executive. The panel reserves the right to request further supporting information. The panel's decision is final.
