



MITO ALUMNI – ELECTRIC VEHICLE - MĀORI SCHOLARSHIP

Please read these terms and conditions carefully to ensure your application is considered.

- Incomplete applications or applications received after 5pm, Friday 17 December 2021 will not be considered
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or resident
- You must have already completed an automotive apprenticeship through MITO that is recorded on your NZQA New Zealand Record of Achievement
- You must be working full-time in the automotive industry
- You may be asked to provide evidence of ethnicity
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are currently completing a qualification through MITO
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are enrolled in another training programme with any other tertiary provider
- The scholarship must be used within one year of it being awarded
- The scholarship can only be awarded once per person and is not transferable to another person
- The scholarship is not transferable to another place of employment should you change employer before the scholarship is completed, unless the new employer is within the same industry and they are willing to support you; and your previous employer and MITO both agree to the transfer
- This scholarship pays the programme fee for MITO's New Zealand Certificate in Electric Vehicle Automotive Engineering (Level 5) commencing in 2022
- MITO will publish details of the scholarship recipients and may ask for further information to help promote MITO's training programmes and the scholarship programme
- A selection panel will be convened by the MITO Chief Executive. The panel reserves the right to request further supporting information. The panel's decision is final.
