Please read these terms and conditions carefully to ensure your application is considered.

- Incomplete applications or applications received after 5pm, Friday 16 December 2022 will not be considered
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or resident
- You must be working full-time in the automotive, extractives, gas or transport and logistics industry
- You may be asked to provide evidence of ethnicity
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are already enrolled in the New Zealand Certificate in Business (First Line Management) (Level 4)
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are enrolled in another training programme with any other tertiary provider
- The scholarship must be used within one year of it being awarded
- The scholarship can only be awarded once per person and is not transferable to another person
- The scholarship is not transferable to another place of employment should you change employer before the scholarship is completed, unless the new employer is within the same industry and they are willing to support you; and your previous employer and MITO both agree to the transfer
- This scholarship pays the programme fee for the recipient's New Zealand
 Certificate in Business (First Line Management) (Level 4) training programme
 commencing in 2023. Please note that the programme has a duration of nine
 months.
- MITO will publish details of the scholarship recipients and may ask for further information to help promote MITO's training programmes and the scholarship programme
- A selection panel will be convened by the MITO Director. The panel reserves the right to request further supporting information. The panel's decision is final.
