Outcome statement/Te tauāki ā-hua

<p>Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu</p> <p>This qualification provides the industrial textile fabrication industry with trade qualified people who are able to produce and assemble complete fabricated items.</p> <p>Graduates will benefit by having a qualification which recognises skills and knowledge in specialist areas of industrial textile fabrication to enable improved job performance and a credential to advance career opportunities.</p> <p>The industrial textile fabrication industry will benefit by having people with recognised skills and knowledge to competently specialise in areas of the industrial textile fabrication process.</p> <p>This qualification is suitable for graduates of the New Zealand Certificate in Industrial Textile Fabrication (Level 3), but is also a credential for those already working in the industrial textile fabrication industry.</p> <p>It is intended to be used in a variety of industrial textile fabrication industry contexts. Graduates will generally work unsupervised.</p>

<p>Graduate Profile/Ngā hua o te tohu</p>
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Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

- Respond to customer queries and technical issues as required to maintain a safe and effective industrial textile fabrication workplace.
- Lead, and contribute to, the fabrication of industrial textile products.
- Evaluate industrial textile fabrication products.

Education Pathway/ Ngā huarahi mātauranga

This qualification follows on from the New Zealand Certificate in Industrial Textile Fabrication (Level 3) [Ref: 2543] and may lead to higher level business qualifications such as the New Zealand Diploma in Business (Level 5) with strands in Accounting, Administration and Technology, Human Resource Management, Leadership and Management, Marketing and Sales, and Project Management [Ref: 2459].

Employment, Cultural, Community Pathway/ Ko ngā huarahi ā-mahi, ā-ahurea, ā-whānau, ā-hapū, ā-iwi, ā-hapori anō hoki

Graduates will have the skills and knowledge to work as tradesperson industrial textile fabrication technicians in the sub sector of the industrial textile fabrication field in which they were trained. For example, Canvas Fabrication Technician or Motor Trimmer.

With context related workplace training they will also be able to use their skills in other industrial textile fabrication sub sectors.

The last date assessment is 31 December 2018, at which time it will be designated as discontinued.</p> <p>Existing candidates may either complete the replaced qualification or transfer to the New Zealand Certificate in Industrial Textile Fabrication (Level 4) [Ref: 2544].</p> <p>Version Information</p>

Version 2 of this qualification was published in November 2018. Outcome 1 was re-worded. The general conditions for programmes were updated and the conditions relating to the graduate profile outcomes were removed.

Version 3 of this qualification was published following a scheduled review.

The last date for assessments to take place leading to version 2 of this qualification is 31 December 2022.
