

Designed in consultation with industry, MITO's training programme will provide new or existing heavy vehicle drivers with the skills and knowledge required to safely and competently drive pilot vehicles to support specialist heavy haulage vehicles with overdimension and overweight loads.

Programme outline

The Level 4 work-based programme is expected to take 7 months to complete.

The programme involves paper-based theoretical training and assessment, and task-based practical training and assessment that is undertaken in the workplace. Learning may also be supported by specific training courses provided by external off-job training providers.

Entry requirements

You must be employed full-time in the industry and hold the correct vehicle licence to enrol in this programme.

Programme Fee

There is no training fee for this programme until 31 December 2022.
