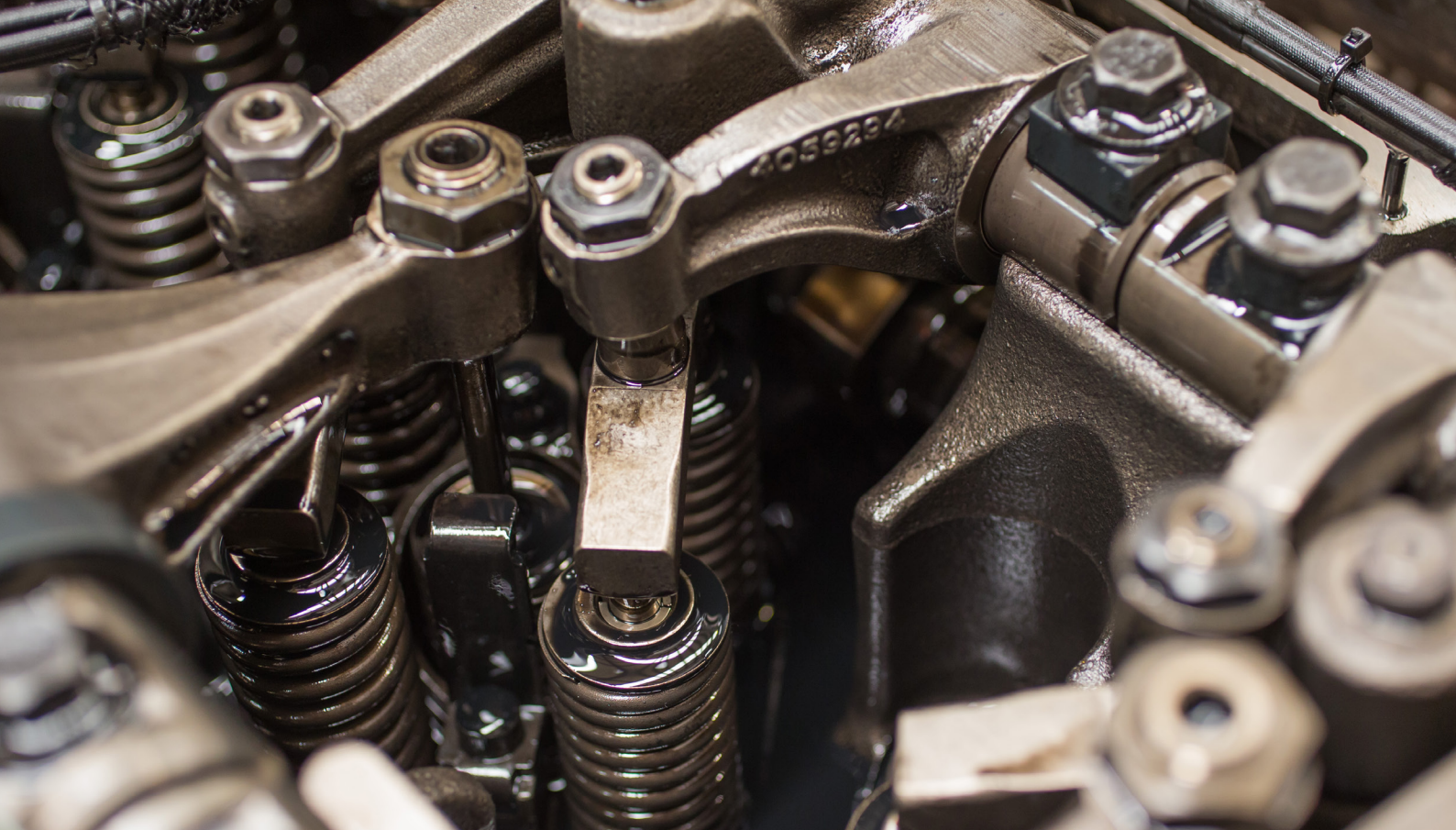
By completing this training programme you will achieve the following qualification:

The Level 4 programme allows you to diversify into Road Transport, Plant and Equipment, Agricultural Equipment, or Materials Handling Equipment.

Programme outline

Learning outcomes include:

1. Follow workplace policies, procedures and relevant regulations to work safely and effectively in an automotive workshop
2. Use tools and equipment to complete basic workshop engineering tasks
3. Apply fundamental automotive engineering knowledge to service engine and driveline systems
4. Check operation of, and perform minor repairs on, electrical and electronic systems
5. Apply fundamental automotive engineering knowledge to service steering, suspension and brake systems.

The programme includes a mix of workplace practical learning and online learning which allows you to complete theory elements of the programme in your own time and at your own pace. With access to online learning resources, including hundreds of videos and interactive simulations, and theory assessments, online learning is an exciting feature of the programme that can be accessed at any time and from any device – mobile phone, tablet or computer.
