Upon completion of this programme, students will achieve the ShiftUp[®] - Road Transport Micro-credential (Level 2, 18 credits), approved by NZQA and listed on their NZQA Record of Achievement.

ShiftUp® can be completed via Gateway (18 credits).

What is the fee per student?

The fee for ShiftUp[®] is \$200* per student, per year. This covers the eLearning theory and practical assessment (managed by MITO) along with the support the school and students receive from sign-up to completion.

How does the student access eLearning?

The student must have a unique email address and access to an internet-enabled computer, tablet or mobile phone. After enrolment, the student will receive an email with their log-in details to MITO's learning management system.

What is a micro-credential?

Smaller than a qualification, micro-credentials certify achievement of a specific set of skills and knowledge and are approved by NZQA.
