

BUSINESS SKILLS – PACIFIC PEOPLES SCHOLARSHIP

Please read these terms and conditions carefully to ensure your application is considered.

- This scholarship pays the programme fee for MITO's New Zealand Certificate in Business (First Line Management) (Level 4) training programme commencing in 2026. Please note that the programme has a duration of nine months.
- The scholarship will not be awarded to applicants that are already enrolled in the programme the scholarship covers.
- It will not be awarded to applicants that are already enrolled in any MITO training programme, or another training programme with any other tertiary provider.
- You must be working full-time in one of the following industries: automotive, extractives, gas, or transport and logistics.
- Applicants must have the support of their employer to undertake the training programme.
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or resident.
- The scholarship must be used within one year of it being awarded.
- The scholarship can only be awarded once per person and is not transferable to another person.
- The scholarship is not transferable to another place of employment should you change employer before the scholarship is completed, unless the new employer is within the same industry, and they are willing to support you; and your previous employer and MITO both agree to the transfer.
- MITO will publish details of the scholarship recipients and may ask for further information to help promote MITO's training programmes and the scholarship programme.
- A selection panel will be convened by MITO's Executive Director. The panel reserves the right to request further supporting information. The panel's decision is final.
- Incomplete applications or applications received after 5pm, 15 December 2025 will not be considered.
