

MITO NEW START – ADVANCED TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIP

Please read these terms and conditions carefully to ensure your application is considered.

- This scholarship covers the training fee for MITO's Collision Repair Level 5, Light Automotive Engineering Level 5, Heavy Automotive Level 5, or Automotive Electrical Engineering Level 5 programme, commencing in 2026.
- You must have completed a suitable pre-requisite qualification and be employed full-time in the automotive industry.
- Applicants must have the support of their employer to undertake the training programme.
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- It will not be awarded to applicants that are already enrolled in any MITO training programme, or another training programme with any other tertiary provider.
- The scholarship must be used within one year of it being awarded.
- The scholarship can only be awarded once per person and is not transferable to another person.
- The scholarship is not transferable to another place of employment should you change employer before the scholarship is completed, unless the new employer is within the same industry, and they are willing to support you; and your previous employer and MITO both agree to the transfer.
- MITO will publish details of the scholarship recipients and may ask for further information to help promote MITO's training programmes and the scholarship programme.
- A selection panel will be convened by MITO's Executive Director. The panel reserves the right to request further supporting information. The panel's decision is final.
- Incomplete applications or applications received after 5pm, 15 December 2025 will not be considered.
