*light 4WD vehicle* means any four wheel vehicle with a gross laden weight less than 3500kg and capable of having motive power applied simultaneously to all four wheels. It does not include an all-terrain vehicle;

off-road means a surface other than a sealed or unsealed, formed road or track and includes but is not limited to bush tracks, beaches, river beds and open paddocks; on-road means a sealed or unsealed, formed road or track;

Service information may include – technical information for a vehicle, machine, or product detailing operation; installation and servicing procedures; manufacturer instructions; technical terms and descriptions; and detailed illustrations.

# Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Drive a light 4WD vehicle with loaded-trailer off-road.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 The route is planned in accordance with the terrain and weather conditions.
- 1.2 Pre-drive check is carried out on vehicle and trailed equipment.
  - Range coupling system, tyres, lights and electrics, bodywork, braking system, load type, load security, weight distribution.
- 1.3 4WD vehicle and trailed equipment are controlled at speeds appropriate to the conditions.
  - Range steering, tracking, angles, brakes, gear selection, reversing.
- 1.4 Stability of 4WD and trailed equipment is maintained while driving and turning.

Range load positioning, load security.

1.5 Traction is maintained and is recovered in situations where loss of traction occurs.

Range situations may include- uphill, downhill, wet conditions, loose surface conditions, rough terrain.

1.6 Trailer is reversed.

Range straight, left turn, right turn.
